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

NEWS AND UPDATES A MESSAGE FROM JANE BOUEY, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF PSS

I hope September has been positive for everyone, though I know it can be a stressful time with children returning to school, especially for parents of neurodivergent kids.

This month, we enjoyed a successful Grandparents Day event (September 8), with over 200 people attending. We've also been expanding our programs to better serve the diverse needs of families.

September has also been a time of advocacy. We wrote to the Minister for Children and Family Development, Grace Lore, about specific concerns regarding kinship care and child protection. As a result, we met with senior MCFD staff, who listened to our concerns and shared helpful information. We've also reached out to Dr. Jennifer Charlesworth, the Representative for Children and Youth (RCY), and have a meeting scheduled in October. We will continue with this advocacy.

Many may have heard the tragic news of the police shooting of Vanessa Renteria, a young mother in Surrey. Vanessa, a newcomer to Canada, came here to build a better life for herself and her daughter, but her life was cut short in a police encounter.

Vanessa had connected with Parent Support Services and planned to join one of our Spanish Language Support Groups. She even applied to volunteer with us, with the goal of becoming a Group Facilitator once she improved her English. Living in a transition house with her 18-month-old child, Vanessa faced difficult circumstances. Her death is heartbreaking and should never have happened.

On September 26th, PSS staff member, Violeta Munoz Berruecos and I joined other organizations and community members, including Battered Women Support Services, at a news conference to call for:

- A full, independent, and transparent investigation into Vanessa's death.
- Accountability for those responsible, including the officers involved.
- Justice for Vanessa and her daughter, who will now grow up without her mother's love and guidance.

Violeta had gotten to know Vanessa and was moved by what a loving mother she was.

As the joint statement said, "Vanessa's death highlights critical concerns regarding the treatment of racialized newcomers by law enforcement. This is not an isolated incident, but part of a larger pattern of violence and discrimination faced by Black, Indigenous, racialized and immigrant communities. We urge local and national leaders to take immediate action to address this injustice and to ensure that no other families have to endure the same pain and loss. We stand united in our demand for justice for Vanessa."

AFFORDABLE CHILD CARE BENEFIT

The Affordable Child Care Benefit is a monthly payment to help eligible families with the cost of child care. Factors like income, family size, and type of care determine how much support families may receive. Families need to renew their application every year. Effective September 1, 2024 decisions regarding eligibility for the Affordable Child Care Benefit are made based on the Early Learning and Child Care Act and the Early Learning and Child Care Regulation. They replace the Child Care Subsidy Act and the Child Care Subsidy Regulation.

MCFD'S NEW LEARNING FUND FOR YOUNG ADULTS IS NOW OPEN FOR APPLICATIONS!

About the LFYA grant: Helps you and other young people with care experience access learning opportunities. Provides a one-time \$1,500 grant to eligible young adults.

Young people may be eligible if they:

- Were born after January 1, 2006,
- Are at least 17 years old but under the age of 36, and

- Have 12 cumulative months in one or more qualifying MCFD or Indigenous Child and Family Service (ICFS) Agency legal status from birth to their 19th birthday. <u>Learn more and apply.</u>


